MODEL PDA293

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1. INTRODUCTION

Congratulations on your purchase of the Credit card size connected organizer (PDA293). A multi-function device, this product provides seven primary functions.

Phonebook

Stores individual names, phone numbers, addresses, and other information in twelve text-field categories.

lotepad

Stores message information and important need-to-remember notes.

Diores inc

Stores Web Site addresses and related information.

Home /World Time Clock

Web site Bookmark

A current-date calendar, local-time clock, and world-time clock for 100 major cities around the world.

Calculato

A 10 digit standard numerical calculator with metric and currency exchange including EURO conversions.

Calendar and Daily Scheduler

A daily planner and scheduler that highlights important dates or specific blocks of time.

PC Sync/Memory Key*

Another feature of your PDA293 is its PC connective capabilities. With a cradle, data can be sychronized with PC; or using Memory Key device to instantly back up your data for retrieval anytime.

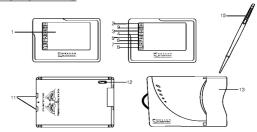
* Memory Key device is an optional accessory.

Using touch-screen technology, primary functions can be accessed in one step.

Unlike conventional databanks that utilize extensive keyboards, your PDA293 simplifies data input. Using an Easy-Touch Stylus, functional sequences are fast and simple to follow. Large easy-to-read display icons enhance the product's user friendliness.

As a final note, take time to read this manual. Understanding the many features of your PDA293 should increase the unit's usefulness and help to avoid mistakes that may otherwise result in lost data.

2. DESCPRITION OF PARTS

Activates and deactivates the unit

Edits records or specific text fields

8. [] Enter Button Confirms an action

9. [MENU] Menu Button Access to Main Menu Display

10. Easy-Touch Stylus

For use when making selections, creating and editing a record.

11. Battery Compartment
Main: Two CR2025 3V lithium cells

12. Reset Button Resets the unit

13. Cradle

Connect with PC for data synchronization

3. DESCRIPTION OF MAIN MENU DISPLAY ICONS

The Main Menu Display has eight (8) icons





^{*} Memory key device is an optional accessory.

4. BATTERY INSTALLATION/REPLACEMENT

If the batteries become low in the course of normal use, an alert appears on the organizer screen describing the low battery condition.



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- 1. Turn off the unit.
- 2. Open one of the battery doors according to the indication on the back of the unit.



- 3. Take out the old battery.
- 4. Insert a new CR2025 lithium battery into the battery compartment.
- Close the battery doors.
- 6. Repeat step 2 to step 5 to replace the other battery.
- 7. Reset the unit if necessary.

CAUTION:

- Make sure to TURN OFF the unit before battery replacement.
- Replace the batteries one by one to avoid data loss (such as phonebook and calendar).

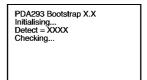
Read "To retain all records and entries after replacing batteries or pressing reset button" inside chapter INITIALIZATION at once after battery replacement.

5. INITIALIZATION

After battery installation or pressing the reset button (by tip of an unfolded paper clip), the following initialization screen will be displayed.

CAUTION:

- Make sure to TURN OFF the unit before bat tery replacement or pressing reset button.



To retain all records and entries after replacing batteries or pressing reset button:

 Use the Easy-Touch Stylus to press [No]. It tells your organizer to start over again. All records and entries stored in your organizer are retained.





2. After initialization, user will be asked to set the date and time

To reset the system from data and program corruption:

CAUTION: All records and entries stored in your organizer are erased. Never press [Yes] to reset the system unless pressing [No] did not solve your problem before.

1. Under normal circumstances, you will not have to press [Yes] to reset the system. On rare occasions, however, your organizer may no longer respond to the touch screen and program function. In this case, you need to press reset button and then tap [Yes] to get your organizer to running again.



Note: After resetting the system, perform a PC sync operation to restore your data previously synchronized with your computer next PC sync.

2. After restart, user will be asked to set the date and time.

6. GETTING STARTED

To turn on the unit:

To enter the Main Menu Display (at any time):

Touch [MENU] Menu.

To select a particular function:

Touch your desired function on the Main Menu Display.

To exit a function:

Touch [ESC]

To turn off the unit:

Touch [] On / Off.

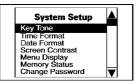
Note: If there is no operation for about 3 minutes, the unit will turn off automatically.

7. SYSTEM SETUP

Initially take a few minutes to personalize the system. Properly setting up the system before use will improve the functionality. The System Setup menu have 9 components: Key Tone, Time Format, Date Format, Screen Contrast, Menu Display, Memony Status, Change Password, Delete Records and About.

To access the System Setup menu:

1. In the Main Menu Display, touch [] , the System Setup menu will be display.



- 2. Touch the desired item to highlight it or touch [▲] or [▼] to scroll upwards or downwards.
- 3. Touch the highlighted item again or [] Enter to access the function.

KEY TONES

When the key tone function is activated, a confirmation beep sound will be output as the Easy-Touch Stylus touches the screen.

To activate/deactivate the Key Tone:

- 1. Enter System Setup and select the [Key Tone].
- 2. Touch [on] or [off] to activate or deactivate the key tone.

TIME FORMAT

User can select 12 hour or 24 hour format for the Home/World time clock.

To select the hour display format

- 1. Enter the System Setup menu and select 'Time Format'
- 2. Select the desired format by touching on the corresponding position.
- 3. To confirm the selection, touch the corresponding position again or touch [] Enter.
- 4. To abort the selection, touch [ESC] Escape.

DATE FORMAT

User can select different date display formats and separators.

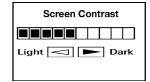
Three date display formats: DD/MM/YEAR, MM/DD/YEAR and YEAR/MM/DD. Four separators: '/', '-', '.' and ','.

To select the date display format and separator

- 1. Enter the System Setup menu and select 'Date Format'.
- Touch the current date format or separator position, a pop up menu with the corresponding items will be displayed.
- 3. Select the desired format by touching on the corresponding position.
- 4. To confirm the selection, touch the corresponding position again or touch [] Enter.
- 5. To abort the selection, touch [ESC] Escape.
- 6. Touch 'OK' to save the settings or touch 'CANCEL' to abort the selection.

SCREEN CONTRAST

Select "Screen Contrast" in the System Setup menu to adjust the contrast of the display.



Direct touch on the contrast bar or touch the left/right icon to alter the contrast level. Touch [] Enter to confirm or

Touch [ESC] Escape to cancel the operation.

MEMU DISPLAY

The Main Menu Display can be shown in icon or text format.

To select your desired format:

- 1. Touch the desired item to highlight it or touch [▲] or [▼] to scroll upwards or downwards.

MEMORY STATUS

Inside the memory status, you can view the numbers of entries of each individual application and the percentage of free memory space.

CHANGE PASSWORD

Your organizer comes with a Security application so that unauthorized users cannot view the entries you wish to protect. A password can be any combination of numbers or letters to a total of eight characters.

Once the password is saved, user will be prompted to enter the password before accessing locked information.

IMPORTANT

Do not forget a password. If a password is lost or forgotten, locked information can not be accessed. To prevent losing information, memorize or store a password in safe place.

CAUTION: Pressing reset button and tap [Yes] on the screen deletes all records and password in your organizer; however, you can restore all synchronized data at the next PC sync operation.

To change or input a new password:

- 1. Enter System Setup and select [Change Password].
- User will be asked to input the Old Password. (If no password is currently in use, user will be asked to input a New Password instead of the Old Password).



Note: For more information about the usage of the on screen keyboard, please refer to the section <u>Create</u> A New Record located in the Phonebook section of this manual.

 Touch [] Enter to confirm, user will then be asked to input the password again for re-confirmation purpose.

DELETE RECORDS

User can delete all the records in a selected category.

To delete all the records of a category:

- 1. Enter the System Setup menu and select [Delete Records].
- A pop up menu will be displayed with six items: Phonebook, Notepad, Web site, Schedule, Anniversary and Holiday.

ENGLISH

- 3. Select the desired category by double click the item or [] Enter position.
- 4. A re-confirmation screen will be displayed, select 'YES' to confirm the deletion.
- 5. To cancel the deletion, select 'NO' or [ESC] Escape.

ABOUT

It shows you the system version number and total memory size.

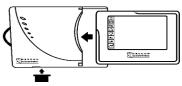
8. DATA SYNCHRONIZATION WITH PC

This unit is designed to communicate with IBM compatible personal computers (PC). Data can be entered on the PC or on the PDA293 unit. After the data synchronization process, both the data in PC and the PDA293 unit will be updated automatically.

To synchronize data with a PC:

- Connect the cradle unit to PC's serial port through a 9 or 25 pin connector (make sure 3 AAA size batteries are installed in the cradle).
- 2. Remove the rubber connector at the left side of the PDA293 unit.

 (User can place the rubber connector on the cradle as indicated)
- 3. Plug the unit in the cradle. The LED on the cradle will be turned on when the connection between the cradle and PDA293 unit is correct. Otherwise, please check the connection or batteries again.



- 4. In the Main Menu Display, touch [] PC Sync/Memory key icon
- 5. Then select [] PC sync.
- 6. Select 'YES' and touch [] Enter or touch 'YES' two times.
- 7. The message "In Progress..." will be displayed.
- 8. Select the 'Easy-Sync' icon on the PC.
- 9. If error message is displayed, please check the connection of the cable and try again.
- 10. Touch the highlighted bar or [] Enter to confirm the selection.

Remark: User is needed to setup the 'Easy-Sync' software on the PC prior to the data synchronization.

9. DATA SYNCRONIZATION WITH MEMORY KEY (OPTIONAL)

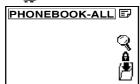
The Memory Key is an optional accessory to instantly back up your data for retrieval anytime. Read the instruction manual of the Memory Key for detail.

10. PHONEBOOK [

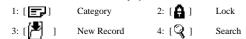
The phonebook is where names, telephone numbers, addresses, and other pertinent information related to an individual is kept. A sequence of steps will direct the user to input the appropriate information in a particular field.

To enter Phonebook Mode:

1. In the Main Menu Display, touch [Phonebook



There are 4 function icons on the display



To enter one of the phonebook's four (4) subsections:

Touch the appropriate icon.

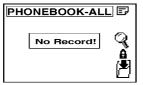
[] CATEGORIES

Phonebook data is divided into three categories: Business, Friends, Others. In addition, an special category 'All' is provided to display all the data within the categories.

Note: The default category is 'All' after system reset.

To select a subdirectory:

- 1. Enter Phonebook Display and touch [] Category to view a pop-up menu with the name and icon of the four categories.
- 2. Touch one of the four categories to highlight it or touch [🛦] or [🔻] to move upwards or downwards through the pop-up menu.
- 3. Touch the highlighted category again or touch [] Enter to accept the choice. If there is no record for the selected category, the message 'No Record' will be displayed.



CREATE A NEW RECORD

The Phonebook contains twelve text fields for which information can be stored. Input information into desired fields

The fields are: Name, Telephone Number, Home Address, Company Name, Company Telephone Number, Company Address, Company Fax Number, Email Address, Mobile Phone Number, Job Title, Birthday, and Remark.

To insert a new record:

1. Touch [] to start editing a new record.



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Note: There are three keyboard maps, each with a specific use.

Touch [ABC] or [abc] to toggle between small and capital letters.

Touch [123] before entering numerical digits or symbols.

Touch [ä] or [Ä] to input European accent characters.

- 2. Touch the desired letters on the keyboard.

- 5. Carry on, in the same manner inputting information into the remaining fields.
- 6. In the Remark field, which is the last field of the record, input information specific to that person.
- 7. When finished, touch [____] Enter.
- 8. User will be prompted to security lock function, select 'YES' to password protect the record.

Note: It is not necessary to work through all of the fields. Enter the desired information and then touch [ESC] Escape to enter the Phonebook display.

BROWSING PHONEBOOK RECORDS

After inputting or editing a record, the user can browse the different fields.

To browse within a record:

1. Touch [] Page Up or [] Page Down to scroll through the fields within a record.

VIEWING OR EDITING EXISTING PHONEBOOK RECORDS

Records in the Phonebook can be displayed or edited at any time.

Note: The system categorizes records as subgroups that are either protected or unprotected. When first entering Phonebook, by default, the system will display the unprotected records.

To display locked records:

Touch [] Lock and enter the password.

To view or edit a Phonebook record:

- 1. Touch [in]Phonebook to enter the phonebook list.
- 2. Touch [] Page Up or [] Page Down to scroll the list.
- 3. Touch the desired item to highlight it.
- 4. Touch the highlighted item or [] Enter to browse the record's fields.
- 5. Touch [] Page Up or [] Page Down to scroll through the fields.
- 6. Touch [EDIT] Edit and follow the procedure as outlined in the section CREATE A NEW RECORD

[Q] SEARCH

A record can be identified and located by inputting a few key words/characters of the record.

To search for a record with only a few key words/characters:

- Touch [i Phonebook.
- 2. Select the desired category or the 'All' category.
- 3. Touch [2] Search.

- 4. Input the key word.
- 5. Touch [] Enter to start the search.
- 6. The result(s) will be displayed.
- 7. Touch [ESC] Escape to exit.

Note about editing a record in [Q] Search:

- 1. Locate the record by highlighting it.
- 2. Touch [] Enter and follow the procedure as outlined in the section, VIEWING OR EDITING EXISTING PHONEBOOK RECORDS.



Information can be classified as protected or unprotected.

Information that has been protected requires a password before it can be accessed.

For information and instructions on how to create a password refer to SECURITY ACCESS in the section SYSTEM SETUP.

Note: The system categorizes records as subgroups that are either protected or unprotected. When first entering Phonebook, by default, the system will display the unprotected records.

To display locked records:

Touch [] Lock and enter the password.

To protect a record:

- 1. In Phonebook Display, locate and highlight the record that is to be protected.
- 2. Touch the record again or touch [] Enter.
- 3. Touch [A] Lock.
- 4. If [on] is not highlighted, touch [on] to highlight it.
- 5. Touch [] Enter.

The record is now locked and will require a password to access the information.

To unprotect information:

- 1. In Phonebook Display, access the locked record by entering the password.
- 2. Locate and highlight it.
- 3. Touch the record again or touch [_] Enter.
- 4. Touch [] Lock.
- 5. Touch [off] to unlock the information.
- 6. Touch [_] Enter or touch [OFF] again.

The record is now unlocked and no password is required to access the information.

To select a protected record:

- 1. Touch [] lock to access a protected records list.
- 2. Input the password.
- 3. Locate the record to highlight it.
- 4. Touch the highlighted item or [____] Enter.

Note: If the password has never been setup, refer to SYSTEM SETUP for information on setting or changing a password.

The password entered must correspond exactly to the password (case sensitive) as it was entered in System Setup.

To change an entry from the protected category to the unprotected category, the user should:

- 1. In Phonebook Display access the locked record by entering the password.
- 2. Touch [] Lock and follow the procedure as listed above.

Important information can be kept as a note or message in Notepad Mode.



To access Notepad Mode:

In the Main Menu Display, touch [] Notepad.

Note: Lock, Create a new record, and Search functions are similar to those mentioned at the Phonebook

CREATE A NEW NOTE RECORD

Information or a note can be entered and stored as a note in Notepad.



To insert a new note:

- 1. Touch [Notepad to enter Notepad Mode.
- Touch [] Create to enter the title field.
 Input a title for the note. A title can be up to 20 characters.
- 4. Touch [] Enter to confirm and to enter the note field.
- 5. Input the note or message.
- 6. Touch [] Enter to browse the information.
- 7. Touch [ESC] Escape.
- 8. Touch Security [ON] to protect the information or [OFF] to keep information unprotected. The selection becomes highlighted.
- 9. Touch [] Enter to accept.

Note: To edit the record, touch [EDT] Edit after browsing the record, and follow the procedure as outlined in the section CREATING A NEW RECORD.

12.1 E-MAIL [

To access your e-mail program, first tap the [$\mathbf{W} \otimes \mathbf{B}$] Web icon on the main menu and then the [\mathbf{E}] e-mail icon. The screen will display the three folders Inbox, Outbox and Sent with the number of messages in each folder.

You can use the arrows on the right of the screen to scroll between the folders and then tap the folder you want to open. Or simply tap the folder twice to open it.



- 1. To send an e-mail, open the Outbox and tap the [at the bottom right of the screen.
- 2. The screen prompts you to enter the recipient [Tot].

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- 3. Use the keyboard at the bottom of the screen to input the e-mail address of the person you want to write to.
- 4. You can input a maximum of 80 characters.
- 5. Then tap [[] ENTER from the functions on the left side of the PDA.
- 6. The screen prompts you to enter any recipients you wish to send copies of the e-mail to [] |
- 7. The Cc field can contain a maximum of 80 characters.
- 8. Tap [] ENTER.
- 9. The screen prompts you to enter the subject [].
- 10. The subject field can contain a maximum of 40 characters.
- 11. Tap [] ENTER.
- 12. The screen prompts you to enter your message [].
- 13. The text body can contain a maximum of 243 characters.
- 14. Tap [] ENTER. The record will be saved to the Outbox folder.

Note: While you are writing your e-mail, you can exit by tapping [ESC] Escape. Your e-mail will be saved as a record in the Outbox, so that you can return to it later using the Edit function.

[DEL] DELETE E-MAIL

- 1. You can delete a message in the folders Inbox, Outbox and Sent by accessing it and then tap ping the [[DEL]] DEL key.
- If you delete an e-mail message in your PDA e-mail application, your next PC Sync operation
 will also delete the e-mail in your e-mail application on your PC. So you never have to delete the
 same e-mail twice.

[EDIT] EDIT E-MAIL IN THE OUTBOX

- 1. You can edit a message in the Outbox by accessing it and then tapping the [FDIT] EDIT key.
- The screen will take you through all the steps outlined above, and you can edit any part using the keyboard
- The PDA then asks you whether you want to save the record to the Outbox folder. Tap yes or no as you require.

Note: There are no functions to edit or create e-mails in the Inbox and Sent folders.

VIEW E-MAIL

- 1. To read your messages in any of the folders, simply tap on the message.
- In the Inbox, unread messages are highlighted in bold font. Messages in normal font have already been read. If you read a message in your PDA e-mail application and leave it in your Inbox, your next PC Sync operation will mark it as read in your e-mail application on your PC.
- You can go back to the previous screen at any time by tapping the ESC function key on the left of the PDA

Note: E-mails with long message texts are truncated when downloaded from a PC. This reduces the time it takes to synchronise the PDA293 and the e-mail application.

[Q]SEARCH

To search for a message in a folder, tap the search icon [\mathbb{Q}]. The screen prompts you to enter a keyword or an index using the keyboard.

- 1. To reply to a message in the Inbox, open the message by tapping on it and then tap [] .] Reply to sender or [] .] Reply All on the right of the screen.
- 2. Tap [] to send a reply message to the sender.

3. The screen will then lead you through the procedure for sending e-mails outlined above, but will have already filled in the recipient [] and the subject [] with "Re:". You have to enter the other recipients you wish to send copies of the e-mail to in the Cc field [] [] []

ENGLISH

- 4. Tap on the [] to send a reply message to all addresses.
- Similarly, the screen will then lead you through the procedure for replying to e-mails outlined above, but will have already filled in the recipient [], any other recipient [] and the subject [] with "Re:".
- The Cc field can contain a maximum of 80 characters. When there are more than 80 characters, the excess e-mail addresses will be cut off.

Note: While you are writing your e-mail, you can exit by tapping [ESC] Escape. Your e-mail will be saved as a record in the Outbox, so that you can return to it later using the Edit function.

Notes on PC synchronisation with PDA293

- In your e-mail application on your PC, it is a good practice to regularly file or backup your
 e-mails from your Inbox, Outbox and Sent to other folders or files. This can reduce the duration
 of synchronization and save the memory for e-mail in the PDA.
- Please check the on-line help file of the "Intellisync® for PDA293" software for the PIMs that are supported with the e-mail function and that can be synchronised using Intellisync®.
- E-mails can be synchronised using Intellisync® only, not with Easy-sync.
- The Inbox and Outbox folders will synchronise by default, while the Sent folder will only synchronise if that is specified by the user manually.
- If you have deleted an e-mail on your PDA, this e-mail will also be deleted from your PC after synchronisation.
- Mail in your PDA Outbox does not contain a "From" field. Intellisync® will add the default user address to this field after synchronisation.
- It is not possible to download attachments from your PC to your PDA. Intellisync® will remove
 the attachments during synchronisation.
- When downloading e-mail to your PDA293, e-mails with long message texts are truncated as follows:
 - "To": 80 characters
 - "Cc": 80 characters
 - "Subject": 40 characters
 - "Body": 243 characters
- When there are more than 80 characters in the "To" and "Cc" fields, the excess e-mail addresses will be cut off.

12.2 WEB SITE BOOKMARK [LII@B]

The bookmark feature is ideal for storing Web Site addresses and related information about a Web Site.

To access Bookmark:

1. In the Main Menu Display, touch [Was] Bookmark.

Note: Lock, Create a new record, and Search functions are similar to those mentioned at the Phonebook section

MARK A WEB SITE ADDRESS

To mark a Web Site address:

- 1. Touch [W@B] Bookmark.
- Touch [] Create to enter the address field.
 Input the address for the web site.
- 4. Touch [] Enter to confirm and to enter the description.
- 5. Input a description or note pertaining to the Web Site.
- 6. Touch [Inter to confirm and to enter the Web Site type.
- 7. Input the Web Site type.
- 8. Touch [] Enter to confirm and view the information.
- 9. Touch [ESC] Escape to exit.
- 10. Touch Security [ON] to protect the information or [OFF] to keep information unprotected.
- 11. Touch [] Enter to accept.

Note: To edit the record, press [[EDIT]] EDIT after browsing the record, and follow the procedure as outlined above.

13. HOME/WORLD TIME [[]

The Home time display has an analog clock icon with a moving hour, minute and second hand.

The current Home/World time city is displayed at the first line of the screen



To access Home/World Time

1. In the Main Menu Display, touch [Clock.

CHOOSING HOME CITY

Determine Home City and then set the current local time and date for that location.

To enter the current time of a home city:

- 1. In Home/World Time Display, touch the icons to toggle between the Home and World time.
- 2. Select [(Home Time.
- 3. Touch the current city (at the 1st line of screen) to display a pop-up menu that contains an index of 100 world cities.
- 4. Touch [] Page Up or [] Page Down to display a new page.
 5. Find the appropriate city from the list of 100 cities.
- 6. Highlight the appropriate city.
- 7. Touch the highlighted selection or [] Enter to accept.
- 8. Touch [Daylight Saving icon to activate/deactivate the daylight saving function.

TO ENTER OR EDIT THE HOME DATE AND TIME

Once a Local City has been selected, the current date and time can be entered.

To enter the current date:

- 1. Touch the Date icon to edit the current date. Work from left to right along the date settings or select a specific character to edit.
- 2. Touch [] Enter when finished or [ESC] Escape to cancel the setting.

To enter the current time:

- 1. Touch the Time icon to edit the time. Work from left to right along the time settings or select a specific
- 2. For 12-hour format, touch the 'AM' or 'PM' icon to toggle a.m. or p.m.
- 3. Enter the time by selecting the appropriate time digits.
- 4. Touch [] Enter when finished or [ESC] Escape to cancel the setting.

CHOOSING WORLD TIME CITY

- 1. Select [World Time.
- 2. Choose the desired World time city as the same procedure stated in CHOOSING A HOME CITY.

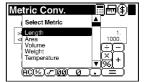

[] METRIC CONVERSION



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There are 5 categories of units that metric / imperial conversions can be made: Length, Area, Weight, Temperature and Volume.



To convert measurements between Metric and Imperial units:

- 1. In Calculator Mode touch [Imp] Metric Conversion on the top bar to enter the Metric Conversion
- 2. Touch the category list to select and highlight the desired units for conversion or use the [\(\bigcap \)] or v to move upwards or downwards to select the desired conversion.

Note: To initiate a conversion, the user needs to first specify the original unit and the target unit to be calculated.

- 3. Touch the line starting with [>] and select the original unit of measurement.
- 4. Touch the line starting with [<] and select the target unit of measurement.
- 5. Input the value to be converted.
- 6. Touch [=] to obtain the conversion.

To reverse a conversion:

1. Touch [←] icon to revert the conversion.

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[(\$)] CURRENCY CONVERSION

The unit provides 19 currencies (include 12 Euro fixed rate) plus 4 user editable currencies from which currency conversions can be made



To set a currency rate:

- 1. Touch [(\$\vec{\pi})] Currency Conversion (located on the first line of display) to enter Currency Conversion
- 2. Touch [Rate] to edit the currency rate.

To convert a given amount of currency to another currency:

- 1. Touch [(\vec{\pi})] Currency Conversion on the first line of display to enter the Currency Conversion Display.

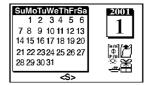

[| DAILY SCHEDULER

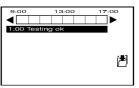
Use the Daily Scheduler to manage various activities during a given day, for example, schedule appointments or indicate an important time.

To input Daily Schedules:

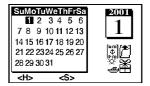
